The purpose of this board item is to certify that Capital City School and John Morse Therapeutic Center meet the eligibility criteria to reapply for Dashboard Alternative School Status (DASS).

The California Department of Education (CDE) makes the final determination for continued DASS participation.

*Note: Previous certifications of eligibility were approved as consent items. In the current year's application cycle it is specified that the school's governing board must hold a board discussion regarding DASS.*



An alternative accountability model for measurement of state indicators.

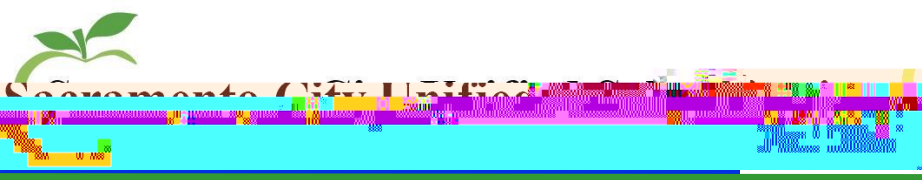
Establishes differentiated methodology for calculating dashboard performance, recognizing the different context of alternative schools.
