RECOGNITION OF TEEN DATING VIOLENCE AWARENESS AND PREVENTION MONTH

WHEREAS, Teen dating violence is a serious and growing problem throughout California; and

WHEREAS, Teen dating violence intervention and prevention programs can help to ensure a positive school climate and safe learning environment for all pupils, address warning signs of dating violence among pupils before behaviors escalate, and protect the safetytetatgetentsand

WHEREAS, each year, an estimated 1 in 10 Amerideenagers is physically hont a boyfriend or girlfriend and

WHEREAS, according to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, Dating Matters: Strategies to Promote Healthy Teen Rehathips, 1 in 4 adolescents report verbal, emotional, physical, or sexual dating abuse each yeard;

WHEREAS, 43% of LGBTQ teens reported expericing physical dating violencend

WHEREAS, 59% of LGBTQ teens reported emotional abuse, compared to 46% of heterosexual youthand

WHEREAS, teen dating violence has been linked to other forms of violence and aggression against peers, including bullying, sexual harassment, sexual violence, and physical violence;

WHEREAS, victims of teen dating violence hairecreased risk for truancy, dropout, teen pregnancy, suicide, having eating disorders, and engaging in other harmful behaviors such as use of alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs;d

WHEREAS, nearly half of students who experience dating violence havetedpthat some of the abuse took place on school grounded

WHEREAS, pupils who are victims in high school are at higher risk for victimization during college, and adolescent perpetrators of dating violence are more likely to abuse their intimate partners as adults; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month will benefit schools, communities, families, and all youth; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Sacramento City Unified School Board work closely with the City, County and other state and local municipalities and community organizations to ensure our students and families are offered a protected space;

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Sacramento City Unified School Board of Education proclaims the month offebruary 2017 ase EnDating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month, and supports communities to emper teens to elvelop healthy and violence free relationships throughout their lives.
