SCTA could not agree on a distance learning MOU, unfortunately students across the district are receiving a hodge podge of offerings that are not reliably equitable. As Sacramento County Superintendent Dave Gordon mentioned in his interview with Capital Public Radio, some teachers are freelancing.

What does freelancing teachers look like in practice? It looks like some students received a pile of textbooks to supplement their access to the online curriculum, while others received none. While all textbooks are online, using them requires internet bandwidth that may be an issue. It would have been much simpler to understand this as

Our negotiations around Distance Learning provided an opportunity to reset the relationshin

between teachers in Sac City and District administrators and the school board. That opportunity has been lost.

But it's important to know, that no matter who sits on the school board or who is the superintendent, Sacramento City teachers will do what they always do: they will teach their hearts out for the students of this district. That is what they have always done, and that is what they will continue to do even if it takes engaging in concerted activity to accomplish that.
