Good evening, I'm David Fisher, the president of the Sacramento City Teachers Association.

I wanted to spend some time talking about our negotiations with the District regarding Distance Learning.

This summer, teachers met with the District more than twenty-five times in an effort to reach an agreement on Distance Learning. SCTA's leadership has been diligent in working with the District to

equity, but one that actually perpetuates and increases the inequities District administrators claim to want to address.

Our negotiations around Distance Learning provided an opportunity to reset the relationship

between teachers in Sac City and District administrators and the school board. That opportunity has been lost.

But it's important to know, that no matter who sits on the school board or who is the superintendent, Sacramento City teachers will do what they always do: they will teach their hearts out for the students of this district. That is what they have always done, and that is what they will continue to do even if it takes engaging in concerted activity to accomplish that.
