
Why 9th Grade?

"Ninth graders have the lowest grade point average, the most missed classes, the majority of failing grades, and more misbehavior referrals than any other high-school grade level. A joint report from




Why 9th Grade?

On average, more than 90% of SCUSD 9th graders begin their freshman year "on track" for A-G Completion



Less than 50% of 9th graders complete their freshman year "on track" for A-G

Graduation "On Track" Rate



Pivoting after Semester 1

Recognizing that initial high quality instruction and targeted student support in the classroom setting improved outcomes

The more that teacher teams are aligned in grading practices and expectations, the better the outcomes

Presence and support of Lead in classrooms aided in application and generalization of student specific interventions

Semester 2 & Quarter 4 intervention

Identifying target group through grades with weekly updates
Devoting time in class for grade reflection /m issing assignment planning with Lead support

Moving into the 2024-25 School Year-

Maximizing teacher capitol, examples: Math I team is calibrating pacing and standards grading Further refining teacher teams to support and design ELA and Math common assessments and grading practices

Professional Learning

The PL Goals of the 2023-24 School Year-

Develop relationships and practices among school site staff, the five ninth grade leads, and Serna staff

PL included 40 hours of Summer Onboarding and two collaboration meetings a month with the leads, site admin, and Serna Staff

The PL Goals of the 2024-25 School Year-

Focus on measurable outcomes and instructional practices

PL will include sessions at the Summer Professional Learning Conference that will directly meet the needs of ninth grade teachers

School year PL will include direct job-embedded supports at the school sites and frequent meetings with the ninth grade leads and Serna staff to engage in ongoing professional learning on measuring student outcomes and develop PL for teachers to develop our aims
