Board of Education Executive Order The FAIR Education Act February 2, 2012

I. Overview of the FAIR Education Act

The primary function of Sacramento State is to provide a high-quality education for all students. The state's focus on student learning and career success (Pillar I of Strategic Plan 2010-2015) requires that all students, regardless of their background, meet the requirements for graduation. The FAIR Education Act (Education Code Section 51922) requires that all students receive an education that is inclusive, respectful, and free from discriminatory content in instructional materials. This includes students from additional groups, including but not limited to African Americans, American Indians, Asian Americans, European Americans, Hispanic/Latino Americans, and students with disabilities. The Act also requires that instructional materials used in classrooms reflect the contributions of men and women of diverse backgrounds, including African Americans, Asian Americans, and European Americans. The Act also requires that instructional materials address the expanded curriculum requirements of the FAIR Education Act.

II. Driving Governance

The FAIR Education Act is a state education code that governs the content of instruction as required by the state.

- I. Instructional Materials
of Educational Materials that contain discriminatory content or that do not reflect the contributions of diverse groups to the practice of the profession. The law does not require that instructional materials be updated. Further, the law does not require that instructional materials be updated in 2015. Core textbooks are not required to be updated.
- II. Instructional Materials
or a school district's curriculum based on the state's required curriculum. The law does not require that instructional materials be updated.
