Create a Design Team of stakeholders to examine grade configuration and program needs.

Following the November 3 discussion and presentation the board directed staff to conduct further research and schedule community meetings for three schools recommended for closure (A.M. Winn, C.P. Huntington and Freeport) and two schools recommended for consolidation (Edward Kemble and Cesar Chavez).
